- (2) Notwithstanding subclause (1), proceedings of a meeting of the Council which is closed to the public shall be recorded where the Council resolves to do so; and
- (3) No member of the public is to use any electronic, visual or vocal recording device or instrument to record the proceedings of the Council or a Committee without the written permission of the Council.

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- (5) Elected Members may request a recording of the Council proceedings at no charge. However, no transcript will be produced without the approval of the Chief Executive Officer. All Elected Members are to be notified when recordings are requested by individual Members.

#### Retention of Recordings

(6) Recordings pertaining to the proceedings of Council Meetings shall be retained in accordance with the *State Records Act 2000*.

#### Disclosure of Policy

(7) This policy shall be printed within the agenda of all Council, Special Council, Electors and Special Electors meetings to advise the public that the proceedings of the meeting are recorded.

## Item PS02-05/19 Reconsideration of Development Application (DA2018/736) for a Child Care Centre at Lot 400 (10) Harbour Elbow, Banksia Grove

I thank the Director of Planning and Sustainability, Mr. Mark Dickson for his responses to the questions I asked at the Council Meeting on 2nd July. They are recorded in the Minutes of that Meeting and they have raised more questions which we, as residents and ratepayers, need to have clarified. Rather than quote the entirety of those questions and responses now, I respectfully ask that those minutes be referred to in order to respond to the following.

 In addition I request a correction of the Item Reference which should read PS02-05/19-Reconsideration of Development Application (DA2018/736) for a Child Care Centre at Lot 400 Harbour Elbow, Banksia Grove. Not PS02-07/19 Proposed Amendment No.2 to the Alkimos-Eglinton District Plan No.18.

## Response by Director, Corporate Strategy & Performance

The correct item reference for PQ01-07/19 has been changed in the Minutes and republished on the City's website.

My original question was why all developments proposed by Hindle Properties Pty Ltd. were not contained within the building envelope as per the DPS2 3.19.4 and 3.19.5 which was to prevail over the general provisions of the scheme. In his response, the Director confirmed that "Schedule 11 of DPS 2 states that all development must be contained within the building envelope."

He stated that, if my interpretation of development was accepted, "then a number of complications would arise" "The first would mean that all driveways and vehicle access from the street boundary to the Building Envelope are not permitted, leaving no means of providing vehicle access to dwellings within the building envelope. Any grassed areas, cubby houses, swing sets etc located outside of the building envelope would also be in breach of the Scheme. No clearing such as for firebreaks and secondary access could occur either."

Further the Director stated that: "If the City were to accept your interpretation it may be found that there are quite a number of properties within the Special Residential Zone in the immediate area that could be considered substantially non-compliant with this interpretation"

- 2. Please clarify the above statements in view of the following:
  - a) Driveways as defined by State Administration Tribunal in their Judgement WA SAT 143 - August 2017 – are described as an incidental aspect of residential uses

## **Response by Manager Approval Services**

Administration agrees that driveways are incidental to residential development in that they are a necessary requirement for means of vehicle access to a development. However they are still an aspect of development of a site and are assessed and approved as part of the development approval process.

In LA ROSA and CITY OF WANNEROO [2017] WASAT 143 the SAT's decision was in relation to the unauthorised parking of Commercial Vehicles on a Special Rural Property, where the commercial vehicles were parked in the driveway. The SAT determined that the activity was classified as a Transport Depot land use under DPS 2 which is not permitted in the Special Rural Zone. Paragraph 24 of the SAT decision which refers to incidental activities as part of a residence is as follows:

The word 'residential' is not defined in DPS 2 or in State Planning Policy 3.1 - Residential Design Codes (Codes). However, cl 1.9.3 of the Scheme states that a word or expression used in the Scheme, but not defined in the Scheme or the Codes, is to have its normal and common meaning. It is commonly accepted that 'residential' in a planning context relates to a residence, in which one resides permanently or for a considerable time: see **Derring Lane Pty Ltd v**Port Phillip City Council (No 2) [1999] VSC 269. It is further accepted that a person who is entitled to use land for the purpose of a residence may use it for incidental purposes, such as garaging his car or housing his boat: Lizzio v Ryde Municipal Council [1983] HCA 22; (1983) 155 CLR 211.

LA ROSA and CITY OF WANNEROO [2017] WASAT 143

This is consistent with the City's approach to dealing with development in the Special Residential Zone where activities that form part of the approved or exempt development (such as a driveway to a single dwelling) although not contained within a Building Envelope are permitted.

b) DPS2 3.19.3 1. Clearing appears to be covered by the approval for the extent to which is necessary for the construction of the approved building.

### **Response by Manager Approval Services**

Special Residential provisions 3.19.3 (f) and (g) do permit clearing outside the approved building envelope if development approval is first obtained from the City. The Child Care Centre application was supported by a Landscape Survey and Landscape Plan, which includes revegetating the site so that all trees that require removal are replaced. As the proposal does not propose to decrease the amount of vegetation on-site the proposal was considered to meet the intent of provisions (f) and (g) of the Special Residential zone. A condition of approval was included requiring all planting and landscaping to be carried out in accordance with the approved landscaping plan and maintained thereafter to the satisfaction of the City.

c) Firebreaks as I understand are required by the Bushfires Act (1954) on all lots including those that are vacant. Are we to understand that all firebreaks are considered a development?

## **Response by Manager Approval Services**

The requirement for firebreaks arises from the *Bushfires Act (1954)*. Development approval requirements arise from the *Planning and Development Act 2005*. Both legislative requirements need to be considered separately and both need to be complied with. Development approval would not be required in most zones, such as Residential, Commercial, and Industry as they would typically not be required or exempt. However in areas that are subject to special controls, for example the Special Rural and Special Residential Zones, approval for firebreaks typically occurs through the land subdivision approval stage when the lots are first created. A Bushfire Management Plan is implemented as a condition of subdivision approval which is issued by the Western Australian Planning Commission. Bushfire Management Plans can address a range of strategies in fire prone areas including the provision of fire breaks.

This matter is also addressed in the City's information sheet titled "PROTECT YOUR HOME AND PROPERTY FROM BUSHFIRES" which is available on the City's website. The information sheet specifically addresses this situation and states:

"Owners and occupiers of Special Rural and Special Residential land should be aware of their responsibilities to take bush fire prevention measures, while ensuring they do not contravene Town Planning Scheme provisions which control the removal of vegetation in these zones."

- 3. With regard to the Directors second statement above:
  - a) Schedule 11 and the accompanying provisions did not apply to these lots before 29 May 2018.

#### **Response by Manager Approval Services**

This is incorrect as prior to 29 May 2018 these provisions were contained within Schedule 14 of DPS2. Amendment 149 made a minor amendment to the Special Residential 2 Description of Locality and did not alter the Special Provisions.

b) Has the City made Schedule 11 retrospective and why did the City seek to identify these lots and alter the provisions if they now need re-interpretation?

### **Response by Manager Approval Services**

The provisions are not retrospective as they were already in place over the area prior to 29 May 2018. Refer to response to 3 (a).

4. The proposed Child Care Centre has a hardstand carpark immediately adjacent to the approved building envelope and larger than the approved building. How would this development be classified? Surely it can't be described as an incidental aspect to residential living?

### **Response by Manager Approval Services**

The approved development is a Child Care Centre. The car parking is part of the Child Care Centre land use and is not a separate or incidental land use.

Ref: DPS2 3.19 THE SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL ZONE

 (d) ONLY one dwelling (a single house) shall be permitted on each lot – I refer to the SAT decision La Rosa versus The City of Wanneroo – DR 6 2017. State Administrative Tribunal dismissed a review of the City of Wanneroo's decision to refuse a development application by Guiseppe and Rosina La Rosa – WA SAT 143 August 2017.

In reference to the above SAT made particular point of defining the word ONLY, and I quote Page 10 of the Judgement: "21 The identification of specific land uses in SR7 is consistent with subclause 3.18.4 a) of the Scheme. The use of the word 'only' avoids any doubt and established the exclusivity of the specified land uses."

The Tribunal came to the conclusion that it was not necessary to consider the merits of the proposal, however, the Tribunal was of the view the proposal would not be approved as the scale of the development applied for was inconsistent with the intent and objectives of the Special Rural zone and would adversely impact on the amenity of the locality and the rural character of the SR7.

Can the Director of Planning & Sustainability assure residents that the Discretionary Approval of Hindle's proposal was subject to the same scrutiny by The City of Wanneroo as was the La Rosa refusal by State Administrative Tribunal? Not forgetting that a Special Rural Zone is also impacted on re the intent and objectives as above.

#### Response by Manager Approval Services

In that decision, the provision that only one dwelling (Single House) may be permitted on each lot was in reference to clarifying that 'Grouped Dwellings' were not permitted being an X (not permitted) land use in the Special Residential and Special Rural zones. That provision does not affect the consideration of other uses that are able to be approved in the zone, such as Child Care Centre, as in the case of No. 10 Harbour Elbow Banksia Grove. Table 1 of DPS 2 sets out the land use permissibility in each zone, where Child Care Centre is listed as a "D" use in the Special Residential Zone.

With reference to the SAT decision La Rosa v City of Wanneroo (CoW), it was determined that the parking of Commercial Vehicles was not incidental to the residential use of the property. For this reason the proposal was considered to meet the definition of 'Transport Depot' which is listed in Table 1 of DPS 2 as an "X" use in the Special Rural Zone and is not capable of approval. A Child Care Centre however, is a D (Discretionary) land use in the Special Residential zone and therefore is capable of approval.

In this respect the matters to be considered in La Rosa v City of Wanneroo are not

comparable to the proposal at 10 Harbour Elbow, Banksia Grove as that was dealing with a use that is not permitted in a different zone.

The application for a Child Care Centre at No. 10 Harbour Elbow, Banksia Grove was determined by Council and was not subject of a hearing and determination by the State Administrative Tribunal. The City's assessment and that of the SAT should be the same. When the SAT makes a determination they are to have regard to all of the same provisions and standards that bind the City.

NOTE: At the meeting, Mayor Roberts confirmed that the Director of Planning and Sustainability would respond to Mrs O'Brien's questions within two days of the meeting and that Mrs O'Brien could take the opportunity to meet with the Director to discuss all of her questions at a mutually convenient time.

## PQ04-07/19 Ms C Cundall, PO Box, Wangara

## PS07-07/19 Amendment No. 180 to District Planning Scheme No. 2 – various Modifications Affecting the Special Residential Zone

This evening Elected Members will be asked to consider a recommendation to amend the local planning scheme by modifying the permissibility of cattery, childcare centre and consulting room from discretionary "D" land use to not permitted "X" land use in the Special Residential Zone. Sadly this action comes too late for those people who asked questions, presented deputations, lodged submissions and raised concerns both before and after a childcare centre was approved for development at 10 Harbour Elbow, Banksia Grove which is in a Special Residential Zone. I draw attention to the City's submission in respect of the review of the Local Government Act 1995. Under the heading "Community Engagement" the City's submission indicates that local governments should be required to engage with the community in the circumstances of "d" planning matters and added a comment "D" certain matters based on impact to the community.

1. The Banksia Grove example shows that childcare centres do impact the community and for that reason ask why the City's current revision of Local Planning Policy 2.3 Chidcare Centres upon which public comment closed today, does not include any requirement for public consultation on applications for development of a childcare centre when the Policy as it currently stands, devotes the whole of Clause 10 to this requirement. Will the requirement for public consultation be reinstated in the revision?

#### **Response by Mayor Roberts**

For the record, the Council refused the childcare centre in Banksia Grove then it went to appeal to SAT and then came back to the Council.

#### Response by Director, Planning & Sustainability

The requirement for public consultation is set out in DPS2, there is no need to repeat the consultation requirements in a local planning policy and on that basis, administration is recommending that section be removed. That does not obviate the need for public consultation still to be undertaken in accordance with the Scheme's requirements.

2. In some of the other planning policies, it does refer to other parts of government legislation, whether it be State or Local, that override or work in conjunction with these, can that also be incorporated in this local planning policy regarding childcare that there will be reference to such things?

### Response by Director, Planning & Sustainability

The draft local planning policies are currently out for consultation. All responses received in relation to that policy will be assessed with the intent of then preparing a report for Council's consideration in terms of whether any changes need to be made in light of that public consultation.

## PQ05-08/19 Mr M Zagar, Gibbs Road, Nowergup

#### PS05-07/19 Current Initiatives Affecting North Wanneroo

The current water crisis and proposed cuts to water licences of 10% without any compensation and without any guarantee of future cuts needs to be addressed. This is having a huge impact on the farming communities, with property values going down already and is causing equity problem as the banks won't lend money, which is affecting growth and investment. If the cuts go ahead this will affect incomes and the ability to pay existing loans. Thank you to the City in its efforts to reject the recommendations.

1. What is the City's forward planning for its land use and for economic strategic development in the area?

## Response by Manager, Advocacy & Economic Development

## Further Response by Manager, Advocacy & Economic Development

In terms of forward planning for the area, the City will prepare an Issues Paper on the North Wanneroo area that will be substantially informed by the current public consultation on the Agribusiness Position Paper. The Issues Paper will inform how the North Wanneroo area is included in the development of the Local Planning Strategy. Once the land use parameters for the area are developed through this process, the likely economic development outcomes will be known.

2. The farmers are united in saying either do not take any water away from their licences or if that is not possible then sensible sub-division of part of the area must be allowed. If taking water away rezoning must be done so the remaining land can have 100% of its water and be economically viable. Is that included in the City's strategy going forward?

## Response by Manager, Advocacy & Economic Development

Question taken on notice with regard to planning issues. The City's position in terms of Agribusiness is quite clear in the draft position paper that is currently out for consultation. Input is sought from all of the stakeholders into that so the City's position on Agribusiness can be finalised and the City certainly does not agree with the proposed 10% water cut.

## Response by Director, Planning & Sustainability

With regard to the planning issues raised, as covered in pages 3 and 4 of the report on tonight's Agenda, the City is in the process of preparing a local planning strategy and the new local planning scheme.

One of the key issues that we will need to consider and address looking forward is the future of the north Wanneroo area and what options are available from a planning perspective that exist within that area. That will involve preparing an Issues Paper for which there will be community consultation.

### Further Response by Manager, Advocacy & Economic Development

The proposed water cuts are not yet official. More information on this will be provided when the draft Gnangara Water Allocation Plan is released by the State Government. If the water cuts become official, it is expected that the viability of the North Wanneroo area for agribusiness will be severely impacted and this could potentially trigger a review of the zoning in the area.

3. Could the interchange at Lukin Drive have a connecting road to Wanneroo Road East?

### **Response by Director, Assets**

Regarding the Mitchell Freeway extension scope of works, in discussions with Main Roads the scope is fixed and will not be altered. The City hasn't considered that scope yet but in our consideration it can be looked at and if possible try to influence that scope. It is State Government's decision on the overall scope of the project.

### **Local Area Traffic Management Policy**

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

The purpose of this policy is to provide an objective framework by which the City's road network can be assessed to determine locations where the implementation of traffic management treatments will be of greatest benefit to the community. As the number of community requests for traffic management greatly exceeds the City's available resources, the policy allows the City to determine where traffic treatments are not appropriate and provides a scoring mechanism to allow for prioritisation of projects in appropriate locations.

#### **POLICY OBJECTIVE**

The purpose of this policy is to have a safe and easy to use road network and to prioritise the provision of traffic management treatments in locations where they will be beneficial to both the community and the travelling public in built-up residential and commercial areas.

#### **SCOPE**

The policy applies to the local road network under the control of the City.

#### IMPLICATIONS (Strategic, Financial, Human Resources)

The current Traffic Management Investigation and Intervention Policy is resourced through Traffic Services who conduct all investigations under the policy. Where suitable traffic management projects are identified through the policy, these are submitted to Council for consideration in the City's 20 Year Capital Works Program. Changes to the current policy are not expected to impact on the level of resources required.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

The following actions are to be undertaken when considering the need for traffic management treatments on local access roads or local distributor roads:

#### 1. Assess the level of investigation

Investigation Levels:	Criteria
No investigation	Investigated within last two years; or
	Site is a cul-de-sac, loop road or other short road where no straight section is greater than 100m; or

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Investigation Levels:	Criteria
	Land development in the traffic catchment is not substantially complete, i.e. less than 90% residential occupancy or planned changes to traffic patterns occur when developments are progressed.
Use alternative method of investigation	The road is a District Distributor road; or
investigation	The road is abutted on both sides by major attractors (eg Main Street Retail); or
	Posted speed limit 70 km/h or over.
Investigate using LATMP without new traffic classifier data collection	Data exists and is less than 2 years old.
Investigate using LATMP with new traffic classifier data	When none of the above criteria apply.

## 2. Generate a Traffic Management Score (TMS)

A Traffic Management Score (TMS) shall be determined in accordance with the details provided in the Local Area Traffic Management Policy Management Procedure.

#### 3. Decide the level of action

The total Traffic Management Score to be considered against the limits in the following table:

Decision	TMS	Action Response
Denoted as Technical Problem Site	More than 60	Considered to be a site that has problems.
		Suitable solutions to be considered for funding and implementation.
Denoted as Minor Technical Problem Site	30 to 60 points	Consider low cost non-capital works solutions (e.g. signageand line marking) if appropriate.
Denoted as a site with low safety and amenity concerns	Under 30 points	No further action required.

#### 4. Report the action

The level of investigation and the action recommended including any Traffic Management Score is to be reported to the person initiating the request for traffic management treatments. 10/6748



#### 5. Further actions

Where traffic treatments are found to be warranted, further investigation is to be undertaken by Traffic Services to determine the suitability of various traffic management treatment options and to prepare concept plans, community consultation and cost estimates for Council approval and consideration in the Long Term Capital Works Program.

#### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Traffic Services is responsible for conducting investigations under the policy and for initiating any further action where the need is identified.

#### **DISPUTE RESOLUTION (If applicable)**

#### **EVALUATION AND REVIEW PROVISIONS**

The policy will be evaluated based on how well it identifies locations in which traffic management treatments are warranted with a review to take place in two years.

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

The objectives of the Pathway Policy is to:

- Ensure that the community's needs for pedestrian and cycling access and mobility are met in a sustainable manner;
- Ensure a walkable and/or cycling pathway network and environment to support
  access to services and facilities that are designed for all users, including vulnerable
  members of the community such as school children, the aged and people with
  disabilities:
- Provide for access generally by way of an interconnected pathway network which facilitate safe, efficient and pleasant walking and/or cycling;
- Facilitate a pathway network which supports the efficiency of public transport systems where available, and provide safe, direct access for residents;
- Ensure that benefits to the community are maximised with the limited funding available for new pathway constructions;
- Ensure that pathways are designed and constructed, in a cost-effective manner, in accordance with Australian Standards and the relevant industry best practice;
- Ensure that pathway requests from members of the community are evaluated in a consistent, efficient, fair and equitable manner;
- Provide guidance on the type of pedestrian or cycling facility to be provided within the City
- Provide a criteria based scoring system for the prioritisation of pathway projects for inclusion in the City's Pathways and Trails Capital Works Program;
- Provide appropriate access for all consistent with the Disability and Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA); and
- Minimise the impact on the environment (eg. minimise removal of significant vegetation) in determining the location and alignment of new pathways.

#### **POLICY OBJECTIVE**

The purpose of this policy is to direct the provision of a safe and accessible pathway network to improve the walking and cycling environment to enable the community to walking and cycle for transport, health and recreation as well as reduce car dependency.

#### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to metropolitan urban areas (predominantly residential), within the City of Wanneroo including the road reserve, Public Open Space, Crown land, new developments and any other area deemed appropriate by the City, with respect to the provision of pathways to serve the community's needs.



This policy will be implemented by all Service Units within the City, land and property developers, property owners, utility providers and any other organisation/individual deemed appropriate by the City.

## **IMPLICATIONS (Strategic, Financial, Human Resources)**

Implementing this policy will result in the following:

- Revised prioritised listing of projects listed in the Pathways and Trails Capital Works Program.
- · Cost of providing pathways to meet the standards outlined in this policy; and
- Costs to developers and external stakeholders in the provision of pathways to the standards outlined in this policy.

Implementing this policy will result in the following human resource implications:

- Additional time required to assess each request from the community;
- Additional time required to prioritise the Pathways and Trails Capital Works Program;
   and
- Training and education of relevant Service Units within the City in implementing the policy.

#### **IMPLEMENTATION**

The implementation of this policy consists of two parts: the pathway design and standards to guide the construction of pathways and priority scoring system to guide the development of the City's Pathways and Trails Capital Works Program.

The policy is considered in two parts:-

Part A: Pedestrian and Cyclist Facility Provision

Part B: Pathway construction and prioritisation.

#### Part A - Pedestrian and Cyclist Facility Provision

All pathways shall be constructed in accordance with the City's Standards and Specifications as well as relevant Australian Standards and Guidelines.

## 1. Pedestrian and Cyclist facility provision

Pathways and cycling facilities are to be provided in accordance with *Figure 1*, Austroads 'Guide to Road Design Part 6A- Pedestrian and Cyclist Paths' and relevant Australian Standards.

#### 2. Surfaces

Placement of Tactile Ground Surface Indicators (TGSI's) shall be prioritised at traffic signals, shopping centres, schools and other high use pedestrian areas.

#### 3. Crossovers/ Driveways

Pathways are to be continuous along a street with crossovers constructed to abut and match the levels of the pathway providing a clear visual cue of pedestrian priority across vehicular access points to properties.



Crossovers are defined to be 'Road-Related Areas' under the Road Traffic Code 2000. Pedestrians and cyclists in these areas have priority over vehicles. Therefore, it will be recommended that the pedestrian infrastructure constructed is in a continuous manner across all residential driveways, maintaining path crossfall and material in preference to the crossover construction.

#### 4. Pedestrian Crossings

All crossing points and kerb ramps shall be constructed in accordance with the City's Standards and Specifications as well as relevant Australian Standards and Guidelines specifically:

#### Australian Standard AS1428.1;

• Austroads, 'Guide to Road Design Part 4A – Signalised and unsignalised Intersections'.

#### 5. Lighting

Lighting of all pedestrian facilities shall be provided to the appropriate Australian Standards. The following Australian Standards apply to pedestrian facilities:

AS1158.1 - Vehicular traffic lighting

AS1158.3 – Lighting for pedestrian areas;

AS1158.4 - Supplementary lighting for pedestrian crossings

## 6. Line Marking and Signage

All new shared paths will be required to be marked and signed in accordance with Australian Standard 1742.9 - Manual of uniform traffic control devices: Bicycle facilities.

#### 7. End of Trip Facilities

End of trip facilities are to be provided in accordance with the City's District Planning Scheme No. 2.

#### Part B: Pathway construction and reconstruction as part of City works.

Construction or reconstruction of pathways within the City of Wanneroo shall be undertaken to maximise the benefit to the community to meet the objectives of this policy. In consideration of the limited funding in the City's Capital Works Budget, pathways will not be considered if any of the below applies:

- · Rural and Semi-Rural area;
- · Cul-de-sac with no connection to existing or future pathway network; and
- Second pathway in an 'access' class road.

The City will use a criteria based scoring system for the prioritisation of all pathway projects within the road reserve in order to determine the order at which they are to be implemented in the City's Pathways and Trails Capital Works Program as detailed below. All pathway projects including those already in the Pathways and Trails Program, together with new requests, are to be evaluated based on this scoring system as part of the annual budget considerations. All cycling projects will be prioritised using the City's Cycle Plan.



## Criteria Based Scoring System

All pathway projects for transport purposes will be assessed against the following criteria and priority points awarded accordingly.

## (A) Trip Attractors

Description	Score
Train station, primary school, secondary school, tertiary institution and major shopping centre – Proposed pathway is within a strategic metropolitan centre or secondary centre (as defined in Directions 2031).	20
Train station, primary school, secondary school, tertiary institution and major shopping centre – Proposed pathway is within a 400m walkable catchment and forms part of a pathway connection to these attractors and/or within an industrial area (as defined in Directions 2031)	15
Industrial area, recreational and community facilities (eg. beaches, community centres, regional parks and Public Open Spaces), local shopping centre, bus route, local medical centre or similar – Proposed pathway is immediately adjacent these attractors.	10
Industrial area, recreational and community facilities (eg. beaches, community centres, regional parks and Public Open Spaces), local shopping centre, bus route, local medical centre or similar – Proposed pathway is within a 400m walkable catchment and forms part of a pathway connection to these attractors.	5

## **Circuses and Performing Animals Policy**

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

The City of Wanneroo ('City') is committed to ensuring that **circuses** or events involving animals comply with relevant legislation, regulations and best practice in all aspects of health and safety, and minimise the risk of improper care of animals.

### **POLICY OBJECTIVE**

To provide:

- guidance on the operation of circuses and use of animals at events within the City;
- guidance for the appropriate location of circuses which minimises impact on the City's natural and built environment; and
- clarification that the use of wild animals for entertainment or display purposes is not supported by the City.

### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to organisations operating circuses or using **performing animals** within the City of Wanneroo.

This policy does not apply to farms, school farms, displays approved by the Curriculum Council or the Education Department of WA, or petting zoos featuring only **domestic animals**.

### **IMPLICATIONS**

Any event held in the City must comply with the relevant terms and conditions contained with the City's Public Community Event process including obtaining relevant approvals for required licenses and permits.

The event must adhere to the following regulations and guidelines:

- The Animal Welfare Act 2002
- RSPCA Policy C02 Performing Animals

### **IMPLEMENTATION**

# Locations

The City supports the provision of circus-type entertainment occurring within the City only at locations where, in the opinion of the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) or an authorised person,



adequate space, parking and ancillary facilities are provided and the facility/location is within ready access of sufficient public transport to cater for the expected attendees. Such locations will only be approved for use by circuses or similar entertainment once per annum, except by resolution of Council.

# **Performing And/Or Caged Animals**

Approval will only be considered for circuses or events where the use of wild animals as either performers or in cages is specifically excluded, both from the proposed event or performance and from the general repertoire of the organisation seeking approval from such an event or performance.

Circuses that include the use of domestic animals will be considered on an individual basis on application to the City via the Public Community Event Application process.

### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Manager Communications Marketing & Events is responsible for the application of this Policy.

# **DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

Disputes in regard to this policy will be referred to the Director Community and Place in the first instance. In the event that an agreement cannot be reached, the matter will be submitted to the CEO for a ruling.

### **EVALUATION AND REVIEW PROVISIONS**

This policy is to be reviewed every three years by the Community and Place Directorate.

## **DEFINITIONS**

DEFINITIONS: Any definitions listed in the following table apply to this document only.		
Circuses	Defined as the occasional and itinerant performances and events held solely for the purpose of providing entertainment including displays of agility, illusion and clowning and which may utilise public open space.	
Performing Animals	Defined as any animal trained and displayed solely for the purpose of entertaining.	
Wild Animals	Defined as any animals normally found in the wild and not under normal circumstances domesticated by humans (including but not limited to big cats, elephants, bears, giraffes).	
Domestic Animals	Defined as any of the various animals which have been domesticated by humans, so as to commonly live and breed in a tame condition (including but not limited to dogs, horses and farm animals).

# Deductible Gift Recipient Status - Wanneroo Library and Cultural Centre

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

The City is committed to the endorsement and maintenance of Deductible Gift Recipient Status that will enable donors to make tax-free donations and gifts to the Wanneroo Library, Regional Museum and/or Gallery, and will enable the City to be proactive in seeking philanthropic funding to support these aspects of its operations.

### **POLICY OBJECTIVE**

The purpose of this policy is to endorse the maintenance of the Wanneroo Library and Cultural Centre (WLCC) as a **Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR)**, enabling donors to make tax-free donations for charitable activities.

### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to the Wanneroo Library and Cultural Centre, to council employees seeking donations to support the Wanneroo Library, Museum and/or Gallery, as well as to donors and potential donors to the WLCC **Gift Fund**.

The policy does not apply to sponsors or potential sponsors whose sponsorship is tax deductible regardless of the Deductible Gift Recipient status of the organisation being sponsored.

# **BACKGROUND**

The City established DGR status in 2011 recognising that the library, museum and gallery located within the WLCC are essential public assets that have the potential to attract monetary donations, grants and donations of physical items.

The City is therefore committed to the endorsement and maintenance of DGR Status to enable donors to make tax-free donations to the library, museum and/or gallery located in the WLCC.

All donations, gifts, bequests or property received by the City of Wanneroo for the WLCC will be received into the WLCC Gift Fund and payments made from such donations recorded against that fund.

It is important to note that DGR status has been granted to the WLCC and not to the City as a whole. Funds gifted to the WLCC Gift Fund can only be spent on the WLCC for charitable



services and activities not on any other City operation. The fund will not be used to reduce the annual commitment of City of Wanneroo towards ongoing operation of the WLCC.

Upon winding up, dissolution or revocation of DGR entitlement for the WLCC, any remaining funds or donated items within the fund, after satisfaction of all debts and liabilities, will be transferred to another deductible gift recipient approved under the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

### **CONSULTATION WITH STAKEHOLDERS**

This policy has been created in consultation with units in the Community and Place Directorate and Finance.

# **IMPLICATIONS** (Financial, Human Resources)

The creation of a Gift Fund and identifying and attracting grants and other donations to the Wanneroo Library, Regional Museum and Gallery are consistent with the objectives of the Cultural Development service unit. In addition, the sourcing of funding from philanthropic organisations is consistent with the objectives of the City's Grants Officer, enabling the sourcing of new opportunities to fund projects and programmes for the WLCC.

Consideration has been given to the additional administrative work required to receive and account for tax deductible donations and the Cultural Development service unit has the resources necessary to meet these requirements.

There are no costs expected in the steps required to obtain DGR status, however, some expenditure could be required should the City of Wanneroo seek to advertise the endorsement of the WLCC Gift Fund as having DGR status.

# **IMPLEMENTATION**

The WLCC Gift Fund will have the following characteristics:

- It will be used only in the furtherance of the objectives of the Wanneroo Library, Wanneroo Regional Museum or Wanneroo Gallery;
- All grants, gifts, bequests and other deductible contributions, whether of money or property, for the above purpose are made to Gift Fund;
- Any money received by the organisation, because of such gifts, or deductible contributions, is credited to the Gift Fund;
- The fund is used solely for the principal purpose of the fund; and
- Upon winding up, dissolution or revocation of Deductible Gift recipient entitlement for the WLCC Gift Fund, the City of Wanneroo is required by this policy and by the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997* to transfer any remaining funds or donated items within the fund, after satisfaction of all debts and liabilities, to another Deductible Gift Fund, authority or institution.



All gifts and contributions to the fund will be recorded through the City's financial management system for grants and cash gifts. A register will be maintained for property, art and cultural gifts.

In addition, the City will record all transfers from the gift fund and investment returns on money or property that has been transferred out of the fund. Contributions to the fund will be clearly recorded separately from the rest of the organisation.

### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Manager Cultural Development is responsible for monitoring compliance with this policy and will provide interpretations in the event of need for clarification.

### **DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

All disputes in regard to this policy will be referred to the Director Community and Place in the first instance. In the event that an agreement cannot be reached, the matter will be submitted to the CEO for a ruling.

### **EVALUATION AND REVIEW PROVISIONS**

Donations received into the WLCC Gift Fund will be the primary means of evaluating the effectiveness of this policy. Separate accounting of transactions made to and from the Gift Fund will enable the City to determine:

- The effectiveness of the City's donation seeking program;
- The success of applications to philanthropic trusts; and
- Whether the administrative work required in the maintenance of a Gift Fund is offset by donations received into the fund.

Organisations and funds that are endorsed as DGRs are expected to be audited annually.

Deductible Gift Recipient endorsement comes with a number of obligations. Accurate and regular financial reporting and self-review for the ongoing eligibility of DGR are fundamental. If these obligations are not met, DGR status may be revoked.

Endorsement by the Australian Taxation Office as a Deductible Gift Recipient is important to the WLCC in its fund raising activities. As an endorsed DGR, the WLCC is required to regularly review its purposes, activities and transactions to ensure that it is still entitled to endorsement. In the event that it is no longer entitled, the Australian Taxation Office must be notified of this fact.

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

# The Girrawheen Koondoola Local Area




The Girrawheen Koondoola Local Area is located in the City's southernmost point and sits within the Established Southern Place Management Area.

The Established Southern Place Management Area includes the established suburbs of Alexander Heights, Darch, Madeley, Wangara, Marangaroo, Girrawheen and Koondoola. It contains a large economic hub in Landsdale and has the largest population of people in the City who speak English as a second language. The area contains a large range of valued bushlands and wildlife species and contains significant regional sporting facilities and open spaces.

The six additional identified Place Management Areas are:

- Transitional Coastal: Yanchep, Two Rocks, and the new subdivisions of Jindowie, Capricorn, Yanchep Golf Course Estate, Vertex, The Reef, and Atlantis
- Emerging Coastal: Currently comprises of the suburbs of Alkimos and Eglinton
- **Established Central:** Ashby, Banksia Grove, Carramar, Sinagra, Tapping and parts of Wanneroo, Hocking and Pearsall
- Established Coastal: Butler, Clarkson, Jindalee, Merriwa, Mindarie, Quinns Rocks and Ridgewood
- North East Rural: Carabooda, Nowergup, Neerabup and Pinjar
- Transitional Rural: Gnangara, Jandabup, Mariginiup and parts of Wanneroo

# Planning Context

The Girrawheen Koondoola Local Area comprises approximately 780 hectares of land, approximately 11km from the Perth Central Business District.

Girrawheen and Koondoola were established in the 1970's with a residential focus and featuring large areas of Public Open Space. The area has been identified for infill development, due to being close to public transport and has a number of established activity centres.

Future development of this area is guided by both a Region planning scheme (State Government level) and a Local planning scheme (Local Government level) which divide the land in a number of broad zones and reserves to control the use of land.



#### **METROPOLITAN REGION SCHEME**

The Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) defines the future use of land and provides the legal basis for planning in the Perth Metropolitan Region. Under the MRS, land use zonings in Girrawheen and Koondoola are predominantly 'Residential', alongside a mixture of 'Commercial' and 'Cultural & Civic'.

#### CITY OF WANNEROO DISTRICT PLANNING SCHEME NO.2

On a local level, the City's District Planning Scheme No.2 (DSP2) is a statutory document which provides the framework for the planning and development of land within the City. DPS2 is required to be consistent with the higher level zones and reserves, that of the MRS, and further classifies various land uses into appropriate zones (e.g residential and commercial) and reserves. DPS2 also includes controls to ensure long-term planning objectives are achieved.

Most of the land in Girrawheen and Koondoola is zoned 'Residential'. Existing residential lots within the local area generally have a residential coding of R20.

There are four Activity Centres located in the area, Newpark Shopping Centre, Summerfield Shopping Centre, Koondoola Plaza, and Hainsworth Plaza, that are zoned 'Commercial'

In 2016, areas around Newpark, Summerfield and Koondoola Shopping Centres were split coded to R20/R40 and R40/R60, in order to increase residential density around these Activity Centres.


The City of Wanneroo owns an area of vacant land behind Koondoola Plaza, zoned 'Civic & Cultural', comprising bushland and car parking. The City is currently seeking a Scheme Amendment to change the current use of the vacant land to 'Commercial' to better reflect the area.

The City also owns a parcel of land adjacent to the Summerfield Shopping Centre that is zoned 'Civic & Cultural' and contains a suite of facilities including the Girrawheen Library, Girrawheen Hub and Girrawheen Koondoola Senior Citizens Centre Inc.

# **Infill Housing**

Following extensive planning and community engagement, the City prepared an Amendment to the City's Local Planning Scheme (Amendment No. 119) to increase the residential density of housing precincts in Wanneroo, Girrawheen and Koondoola. The Amendment was approved by the Minister for Panning and came into effect in April 2016. Areas of Girrawheen and Koondoola were then recoded from R20 to R20/R40 and R20/R60 and provisions were introduced into the City's Planning Scheme to guide subdivision and development at the higher density code.


Since this time, a number of new residential developments have been occurring in the area to replace aging housing stock and provide a range of housing options.







The addition of dwellings to the housing stock is a major driver of population growth in an area, providing opportunities for households to relocate from other areas or new households to form locally. Amendment 119 is also expected to have an effect by allowing higher density residential homes in certain areas of Girrawheen and Koondoola.

# Community Engagement

Local residents participated in a range of community engagement activities over a two month period to discuss what made Girrawheen and Koondoola unique as a place to call home.


### **KOONDOOLA PLAZA (2017)**

In 2017 the City engaged with the wider community about the revitalisation and future of Koondoola Plaza.

Key findings were that:

- The Centre is used for its convenience;
- The multi-cultural variety of food available is highly regarded;
- The Centre is run-down and in need of significant improvements; and
- Anti-social behaviour in and around the Centre adds to feelings of insecurity.

These comments are supported by the more recent findings of the Local Area Plan engagement.



Girrawheen Place Activation Plan - site area

### **GIRRAWHEEN PRECINCT PLACE ACTIVATION PLAN (2018)**

Focused on the area containing Girrawheen Hub, Library and Senior Citizens Centre including the Summerfield Shopping Centre, churches and schools, this project drew on local knowledge to prioritise and guide greater community connection and use of the site. Over 200 conversations were held, resulting in the community identifying 'Amenity', 'Beautification', 'Activities & Programs', 'Community Connections' and 'Access' as key priorities. These priorities have been integrated into the Girrawheen Local Area Plan, as well as specific programs being undertaken in the Girrawheen Precinct.

### GIRRAWHEEN AND KOONDOOLA RECODING - SCHEME AMENDMENT 119

This engagement investigated support for the recoding of areas of Girrawheen and Koondoola to higher density under Amendment 119. Public comment on the proposal was overwhelmingly supportive with around 91% of respondents in support and the recoding came into effect on 29 April 2016.

#### **GIRRAWHEEN AND KOONDOOLA**


Through the conversations and comments made, a picture was created of community in Girrawheen Koondoola that:

- Has strong ties based on longstanding neighbour, friends and family relationships;
- Values outdoor facilities highly, but remains reluctant to use them to full extent because of safety, amenity and upkeep concerns;
- Is proud of its multicultural diversity and the influence that has on built environment, but concerned about the way that public spaces are presented and the effect this has on community reputation;
- Would like better local access to City services that are customer facing such as Rangers, Community Development and Library; and
- Appreciates job training and small business development opportunities that are offered in the area.



# Community Priorities

Key themes and priorities for Girrawheen and Koondoola are outlined below. These priorities are not separated into positive or negative, but serve to outline what is important to the community. These priorities listed below are linked directly to the Action Plan commencing on page 28.



#### **PARKS/TREES**

Well-maintained and well equipped parks are a high priority. Comments included requests for amenity upgrades, improved access to toilets, better footpath connections, and concerns about safety and antisocial behaviour. Mature trees, bushland conservation areas and sustainability were seen as unique characteristics of the area. Increasing the number of trees (including fruit trees) in parks and on verges is seen as a priority.

#### **RESPONSE:**

The Action Plan details a four year program of improvements to public spaces and parks. See 'Capital Works Program' in Action Plan below for details. (Refer Action # 5)

#### **SAFETY**

There is a perceived lack of safety in public spaces, lack of walkability and reluctance to engage outside of homes and public buildings. Improved lighting, greater CCTV coverage and other Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED) measures were requested, along with an attention to safety around key activity areas and shopping centres.

#### **RESPONSE:**

Federal funding is being sought through the 'Safer Communities' program for installation of equipment, hard infrastructure and programming initiatives. (Refer Actions # 3, 6)

Initiatives being considered include a Community Safety Forum at Girrawheen Library, City focus on image management and maintenance of public areas, youth leadership reference group, partnership with Crime Stoppers and other passive/formal surveillance measures

# Community Priorities continued...

#### SHOPPING CENTRES AND LOCAL BUSINESS

The variety and uniqueness of the multicultural and specialised retail offer (particularly around food) is highly valued, but the neglected state and presentation of activity centres is a concern. The poor state of Koondoola Plaza was specifically mentioned with many requests for the City take a leadership role in addressing the safety and presentation of the neighbourhood. It is worth noting that only positive comments were received in relation to Hainsworth Plaza.

#### **RESPONSE:**

The City intends to hold a facilitated workshop with the four shopping centres to explore opportunities for urban regeneration and increased amenity. (Refer Action # 1)

#### **SENSE OF COMMUNITY CONNECTION**

Connections with friends, family and neighbours and memories of growing up and raising children in the area were a common theme. Residents placed a high value on the positive role of schools in the area and on the area's mix of cultures and ethnic diversity. Suggestions included a stronger focus on promoting events and activities within and to the community, the forming of a collective group to support positive community development, and a celebration of multicultural traditions within the community.

#### **RESPONSE:**

City staff coordinate a range of community development programs in the area to support cohesive communities, and facilitates networks including the Multicultural Action Group (Refer Actions # 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11)

#### LANDSCAPE AND MAINTENANCE

There is a strong perception that not as much upkeep was applied to Girrawheen and Koondoola compared to other suburbs in the City. This was perceived to have a negative effect on community safety. Respondents requested attention to nature strips and verges, and proactive programs to help residents improve and upkeep their verges. Graffiti and general rubbish are concerns and several requests were made for a 3 bin system for residents.

#### **RESPONSE:**

The City has an annual plan that commits resources to landscaping, waste management

and maintenance of buildings. Comments from residents during the consultation have been passed on to relevant service units for attention. (Refer Action # 3)

#### **TRAFFIC & CONNECTIONS**

While improvements to school pick up/drop off areas or specific intersections were requested, there was a focus on improved pedestrian crossing safety and better cycle and footpath connections. A number of positive comments were received on access to public transport.

#### **RESPONSE:**

The Action Plan details a four year program of improvements to roads and the City will continue to work with Department of Transport on applying 'Safe and Active Streets' approach to pedestrian and cycle networks. See 'Capital Works Program' in Action Plan below for details. (Refer Action # 4)

#### **LOCATION**

The central location of the area relative to the CBD, beach, shops and schools was highly valued. Related themes included walkability between local facilities, the affordability of housing in the area and the positive nature of recent residential estate developments.

#### **RESPONSE:**

The City is committed to supporting sustainable property and economic development that capitalises on the central location of the area.

#### **FACILITIES/LIBRARY**

Lack of public toilets (or locked public toilets) was seen as a barrier to longer use of the parks by families in the area. The Girrawheen Library is a highly valued community asset with many constructive suggestions for longer opening hours, increased security outside the facility and building upgrades. Many comments were received about the function of the Library as a community meeting space for all.

#### **RESPONSE:**

The importance of built facilities to the community has been acknowledged and reflected in the Action Plan. (Refer Actions # 2, 7, 8, 9, 10)


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
# Services, Programs and Facilities

Residents were asked to identify their current and potential use of services, programs and facilities in their local area.


# Key findings included:



It will assist in building organisational capacity to:


- ensure that place based planning, design and access to services is provided;

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
#### **VISION STATEMENT:**

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



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# Yanchep/Two Rocks Local Area



The Yanchep Two Rocks Local Area is located in the City's far north and sits within the Transitional Coastal Place Management Area.


The Transitional Coastal Place Management Area includes the established suburbs of Yanchep and Two Rocks and the new sub-divisions of Jindowie, Capricorn, Yanchep Golf Course Estate, Vertex and The Reef and Atlantis in Two Rocks. The area is rich in beautiful coastline and includes the Yanchep Lagoon which local residents refer to as the "jewel in the crown" of the region's coastline. The region is also home to parts of Yanchep National Park and its attractions including local caves and resident koalas which attract tourists to the vicinity. Strategically, Yanchep has also been identified as Perth's next Strategic Metropolitan Centre with Two Rocks assuming Secondary Centre status.

The six additional identified Place Management Areas are:


- Emerging Coastal: Currently comprises of the suburbs of Alkimos and Eglinton

# Planning Context

The Yanchep and Two Rocks Local Area comprises approximately 7,550 hectares of land within the northernmost extent of the Perth Metropolitan Region, approximately 60km from the Perth Central Business District. It is almost all identified by the State Government for future urban development

Development in Two Rocks and Yanchep will be supported by a range of services and infrastructure including the METRONET Yanchep rail line extension and station and, in time, the extended Mitchell Freeway. The Yanchep City Centre is expected to become the City of Wanneroo's largest centre and offer a range of retail, housing, employment, health, education, recreation and leisure opportunities.

The new Yanchep City Centre and adjoining large tracts of land between Yanchep and Two Rocks (approx. 3,500 hectares) are owned by the Yanchep Beach Joint Venture with much of this land identified for future residential use. Growth estimates for the region project the population of Yanchep to reach 45,000 people by 2042 with Two Rocks becoming home to over 20,000 people in this timeframe.

Future development of this area is guided by both a region planning scheme (State Government level) and a local planning scheme (Local Government level) which divide the land into a number of broad zones and reserves to control the use of land.

#### METROPOLITAN REGION SCHEME

The Metropolitan Region Scheme (MRS) defines the future use of land and provides the legal basis for planning in the Perth Metropolitan Region. Under the MRS, Yanchep and Two Rocks are mainly zoned 'Urban' or 'Urban Deferred', with some smaller areas zoned 'Rural' (the existing Seatrees Estate), 'Industrial', 'Central City' (future Yanchep City Centre), and 'Private Recreation' (existing Sun City Golf Course). There are also large areas reserved for 'Parks & Recreation' to the north-east and southern parts of the Local Area and along the full extent of the coastal foreshore.

#### **CITY OF WANNEROO DISTRICT PLANNING SCHEME NO. 2**


On a local level, the City's District Planning Scheme No. 2 (DPS 2) is the statutory document which provides the framework for the planning and development of land. DPS 2 is required to be consistent with the higher level zones and reserves of the MRS, and further classifies various land uses into appropriate zones (e.g. residential and commercial) and reserves. DPS 2 also includes controls to ensure long-term planning objectives are achieved. Most of the land in Yanchep and Two Rocks is zoned 'Urban Development', which requires the preparation and approval of Structure Plans before urban development can occur.


Existing residential lots within the local area generally have a residential density coding of R20 and R30 under DPS 2, with higher densities occurring around the area's existing and planned activity centres (Yanchep Shopping Centre, Two Rocks Shopping precinct and Marina, future Yanchep City Centre). Some older blocks in the original town site areas have been identified for potential re-coding in the future for redevelopment purposes as these areas grow.

## District and Local Structure Plans

The Yanchep —Two Rocks District Structure Plan applies over the entire Local Area and provides a broad framework for the future urban development of the area.

PLAN 1 - YANCHEP - TWO ROCKS DISTRICT STRUCTURE PLAN MAP








## Other Recent Community Engagement

#### "Y' SPEAK YOUTH ENGAGEMENT

Between 2015 and 2017, The City of Wanneroo engaged with young people in Yanchep and Two Rocks to understand their needs and interests. A survey was completed by 430 community members between the ages of 9 and 25 years of age.

Analysis of the survey results found a number of key priorities:

- 1. Activation, Access and Services
- 2. Youth Designated Space and Activities
- 3. Participation, Leadership and Celebration
- 4. Health, Safety and Wellbeing

Other key findings included:

- Young people expressed a desire for an increase in services and activities that
  highlight the natural beauty of Yanchep and activate the area for both the existing
  community and those visiting.
- The community prioritised support for improvements in infrastructure, including
  pathways, parks, street lighting and public transportation. Community members noted
  limited transport links within the area and communicated a desire to see an increase
  in activities and services within Yanchep in order to improve access.
- The need for an increase in youth services and facilities. Participants indicated value
  in facilities and services for families and young people to access which are safe and
  open to the community. Considerable interest was given to the inclusion of a skate
  park and pool within Yanchep. Top ranked facilities for young people in Yanchep
  included the following:

- Recreational Facility
- Youth Centre
- Training Facility
- Community Centre
- BMX/Skate/Scooter Facility
- Barriers accessing facilities and services such as location, cost, transport, no-one
  to go with and safety were significant factors to young people. Facilities and services
  should focus on activating Yanchep, providing a hub for services and information.
- The need for a better understanding of local government's role in community and
  opportunities for community members to actively contribute to their community.
  Young people expressed the need for the City to consult with community regarding
  the planning of future youth facilities. Young people advised the importance of
  informing community of the outcome of consultations and identified the need for
  further investigation into appropriate communication methods to improve process
  for feedback to community.

## Other Recent Community Engagement continued...

#### YANCHEP LAGOON MASTER PLAN ENGAGEMENT

In 2019 the City worked with the consultants Roberts Day to develop a Master Plan for the Yanchep Lagoon precinct. Residents and key stakeholders were provided with a range of opportunities to participate in the master planning process including Social Pinpoint, Your Say and the opportunity to attend a two day planning workshop based on the future of the lagoon precinct. The engagement process attracted 1,595 Social pinpoint engagements, 298 completed surveys and over 30 on site interviews with community members.

Key Messages from Respondents were:

- Keep it natural
- Keep it special
- Keep it local
- Keep it simple

The key messages relating to the lagoon precinct link in strongly with the values community members expressed about the Yanchep Two Rocks region as a place to live and the importance in which community members view the regions unique coastal and natural environment.

# Local Area Vision

Through the conversations and comments made, a picture was created of community in Yanchep and Two Rocks that:



## Community Priorities continued...

#### **JOBS, BUSINESS, TOURISM AND ECONOMY**

The growth of business, tourism and the economy and subsequent local employment opportunities are a high priority for the community.

#### RESPONSE

The City will continue to provide support for the creation of local businesses and employment opportunities. (Refer Action # 1)

#### CONNECTEDNESS AND LIFESTYLE

The community value their lifestyles and want a community that is accessible, connected and pedestrian friendly. Respondents also wanted better road links, METRONET and better/more beach access points and parking. Major dual use path links to the National Park and into Two Rocks were also raised as initiatives that would benefit the community.

#### RESPONSE

The Action Plan details a four year program of improvements under the 'Capital Works Program' in the Action Plan section for details. The Mitchell Freeway North extension and METRONET are State Government projects with the dualling of Marmion Avenue from Butler to Yanchep being funded by the State Government but undertaken by the City. The City will continue to advocate for major transport projects to improve access to Yanchep and Two Rocks. The City's Wanneroo Cycle Plan details future links to the area including the National Park and secondary links in Two Rocks. (Refer Actions # 1,2,4)

### **CITY FACILITIES (INCLUDING SWIMMING POOL)**

There was strong community opinion that a swimming pool should be constructed in Yanchep

#### RESPONSE

The City is currently investigating the feasibility of constructing a swimming pool in the northern growth corridor and is finalising the North Ward Aquatic and Recreational Feasibility Study. (Refer Action # 3)

#### COAST AND ENVIRONMENT

While the coast, beaches and environment are highly valued by the community, improvements can be made to beach access points and associated parking in both Yanchep and Two Rocks.

#### RESPONSE

The City is currently preparing the Coastal Management Plan (Part 2) to identify preferred locations of future beach access points and parking. (Refer Actions # 2, 4, 5)

#### **PARKS, VERGES AND GARDENS**

The community highly value existing parks, verges and gardens and the role they play in making the community more attractive and liveable.

#### RESPONSE

The City has a four year capital works plan for the upkeep and provision of parks, verges and gardens in the region. (Refer Action # 5)

#### **YANCHEP LAGOON**

Although the lagoon is undergoing a Master Planning process it still featured strongly in responses as a valued community asset

#### RESPONSE

The Draft Yanchep Lagoon Master Plan comment period has now closed; initial actions from the Plan including the priority development of the old Surf Club site should commence in the near future. (Refer Action # 6)




## Services, Programs and Facilities

### Key findings included:


- 'Job skills' and 'small business development' were reported as the most utilised programs;

It will assist in building organisational capacity to:


- ensure that place based planning, design and access to services is provided;



Provides a basis for the control of residential development throughout Western Australia.

LIVEABLE NEIGHBOURHOODS

Primary policy for design and assessment of structure plans (regional, district and local) and subdivision for new urban areas in Perth metropolitan and Peel regions and major regional centres, on greenfield and large infill sites.

There are no Aboriginal Heritage sites listed within the Local Heritage Survey as Aboriginal sites are afforded protection under the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972.
CULTURAL PLAN (2018 – 2022)	Provides a strategic focus for the City to foster community participation in culture and the arts. Actions under the Learning, Creative and Community priorities are most applicable to the Yanchep and Two Rocks communities and are reflected in the City's ongoing support of activities to build community capacity and resilience.
WANNEROO CYCLE PLAN (2018/19 -2021/22)	Provides an outline of future Cycle pathways to be built by the City. New cycle pathways include the construction of shared paths along Mitchell Freeway North extension to Romeo Road and the Marmion Avenue dualling project from Butler to Yanchep. Connections from Marmion Avenue to train stations will also be included. Further secondary cycle networks in Yanchep and Two Rocks will be subject to funding by WA Bike Network and the City's Capital Works Program.
CCTV SERVICE PLAN (2018/19 - 2021/22)	Aims to detail the current service delivery model and identify relevant issues and opportunities for improved service. This plan will be considered in the delivery of the Splendid park Skate Facility.

The Plan notes a low percentage of qualifications held across the City in relation to Greater Perth and the need to provide opportunities for community strengthening that meets social, economic and digital demands. The level of qualifications held is lower in Yanchep and Two Rocks, indicating a need to provide good access to Library services.
LOCAL PLANNING POLICY 3.1: LOCAL HOUSING STRATEGY IMPLEMENTATION	Provides a framework to guide the planning and development of increased housing density in existing suburbs in the City of Wanneroo, including in Yanchep and Two Rocks.
LOCAL PLANNING POLICY 4.23 – DESIGN REVIEW PANEL	A panel that provides technical advice and recommendations on the design and site planning of certain planning proposals. The Design Review Panel is advisory only and does not have a decision-making function. Major development applications in Yanchep and Two Rocks will be referred to the panel for input.
LOCAL PLANNING POLICY 4.3 – PUBLIC OPEN SPACE	Articulates requirements for the planning, design and development of new and existing Public Open Spaces.

The planned Yanchep City Centre will become a major activity centre as the area will become a future Strategic Metropolitan Centre.

The Policy seeks to address long commutes to work, the ability of the transport system to handle significant community demands, security problems, pollution and energy demands caused by transportation requirements, through to expenditure leakages out of the local economy.





#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

This Policy documents the City of Wanneroo's (the City) commitment to identifying, analysing, assessing and managing risks across the organisation that may impact on the City achieving its business objectives.

#### **POLICY OBJECTIVE**

The objective of this Policy is to ensure that the City applies and embeds a systematic risk management approach across the City in relation to all activities, functions, service delivery and decision-making.

This Policy aligns with the Australian Standard (AS) ISO 31000:2018 Risk Management – Guidelines.

An approved, robust and consistently applied risk assessment criteria will be used in the assessment of risks, and Council will review and consider the Strategic risk profile of the City at least bi-annually.


The City will actively anticipate and manage their risks, taking advantage of opportunities and containing potential hazards in line with the City's risk tolerance. The risks facing the City change frequently and the City will proactively:

- Utilise experience through knowledge sharing;
- Deal with ambiguity, uncertainty and increasing complexity;
- Prioritise, make decisions and implement solutions on a timely basis;
- Recognise and act on opportunities as they occur;
- · Ensure optimised results in spite of a changing business environment; and,
- Ensure risk management is part of governance and leadership, and is fundamental to how the City is managed, operates and makes decision across all levels.

## **SCOPE**

The City is one of the largest and fastest growing local governments in Western Australia providing infrastructure and services to the community under the auspices of the *Local Government Act 1995*.

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The City delivers diverse business activities including infrastructure, planning, programming and community services with a range of issues requiring oversight, management and response. This Policy covers all aspects of the City's activities, business and operations.

#### **IMPLICATIONS**

This Policy aligns with the City's Strategic Community Plan as it aims to achieve strong Civic Leadership through providing transparent and accountable governance and leadership; providing responsible resource and planning management which recognises the City's significant future growth. Decision making and policy positions are developed considering all relevant and pertaining information including the risks to achieving outcomes.

## **IMPLEMENTATION**

The City's Enterprise Risk Management team will manage and monitor the implementation of the Risk Management Policy. Administration will progress the work required to ensure that risk management processes are appropriately embedded into operational activities to enable appropriate risk reporting to the Audit and Risk Committee and, if applicable, to Council.

## **RISK APPETITE**

Council determines the City's risk appetite to achieve the strategic objectives and will review this at least annually in line with a review of the City's Strategic risks.

Council's risk appetite is captured within separate Risk Appetite Statements (RAS).

Council endorses the City's **RAS** which Administration will then contextualise through application of the Risk Assessment Criteria.

The City's Enterprise Risk Management procedures define the processes for identifying, analysing, assessing and proactively managing those risks in accordance with the Risk Acceptance and Reporting Criteria as detailed below (this tool forms part of the Risk Assessment Criteria).



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# **Enterprise Risk Management Framework integration with Integrated Planning Framework**

The Enterprise Risk Management Framework articulates the City's commitment to applying risk management processes to facilitate achievement of the City's strategic objectives which is depicted in the diagram below.



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## **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

## Council

Council determines the risk appetite appropriate to achieve the City's Strategic objectives and review this annually in line with the City's Strategic Risks.

Council is engaged/involved in the review of the City's Strategic Risks and endorses the City's Strategic Risk profile.

Council approves the City's Risk Assessment Criteria.

## **Audit and Risk Committee**

The Audit and Risk Committee reviews the City's Strategic Risks, including the mitigation strategies and refers them to Council for endorsement.

## **Chief Executive Officer (CEO)**

The CEO is responsible for reviewing and managing Strategic and Corporate risks and, furthermore, from time to time, request ad-hoc internal audits or other reviews on extreme and high rated risks identified to timely verify the controls implemented to mitigate or reduce these risks to an acceptable level and to report on any remaining control deficiencies to the Audit and Risk Committee in a timely manner.

## **Executive Leadership Team (ELT)**

The Executive Leadership Team is accountable for identifying, analysing, assessing, reviewing and managing Corporate risks and will receive and review reports on the City's responses to managing risks.

## All Employees / Contractors / Consultants

Every employee within the City is recognised as having a role in risk management; this involves vigilance in the identification and ongoing management of risks and participating in the risk management process.

## WHO NEEDS TO KNOW ABOUT THIS POLICY?

All Elected Members, employees, contractors, consultants and volunteers of the City of Wanneroo.

## **EVALUATION AND REVIEW PROVISIONS**

The Policy will be reviewed every 3 years in accordance with the requirements of this Policy.

Regular performance reporting on the effectiveness of the City's systems and controls in relation to management of risks will be presented to the Audit and Risk Committee.


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# **DEFINITIONS**

Corporate Risk Risk impacting or affecting more than one directorate which eventuates from inadequate of failed internal processes, people and systems, or from external events. Operational Risk Risk managed at Service Unit level by the Manager resulting from inadequate or failed internal processes, people and systems, or from external events. Risk Appetite ISO Guide 73:2009 Risk management vocabulary defines risk appetite as "the amount and type of risk that an organisation is prepared to pursue, retain or take also known measured as residual risk". For example, the total impact of risk an organisation is prepared to accept in the pursuit of its strategic objectives. Risk Assessment A matrix that is used during risk assessment to define the level of risk by considering the category of consequence severity against the Criteria likelihood. AS ISO 31000:2018 defines risk as "effect of uncertainty on Risk Management objectives". A risk is often specified in terms of an event or circumstance and the consequences that flow from it. Risk Management AS ISO 31000:2018 defines a risk management framework as a "set Framework of components that provide the foundations and organizational arrangements for designing, implementing, monitoring, reviewing and continually improving risk management throughout the organization". Risk Management An operational document intended to guide the Administration in applying the Risk Management tools and methodology. Manual Risk Tolerance ISO Guide 73:2009 Risk management vocabulary defines risk tolerance as an Organisation's or stakeholder's readiness to bear the risk after risk treatment in order to achieve its objectives. For example, the total impact of risk an organisation is prepared to accept and tolerate in the pursuit of its strategic objectives. Strategic Risk The effect of uncertainty that may impact the achievement of the City's Strategic Community Plan. These risks are aligned against the Strategic Community Plan objectives to assist with integrating the risk dimension within integrated planning.

## **Local Government (Audit) Regulations Amendment**

Amendments to the *Local Government (Audit) Regulations 1996* came into effect on 9 February 2013. Specifically, clause 17 which states:

- "17. CEO to review certain systems and procedures
- (1) The CEO is to review the appropriateness and effectiveness of a local government's systems and procedures in relation to
  - (a) risk management; and
  - (b) internal control; and
  - (c) legislative compliance
- (2) The review may relate to any or all of the matters referred to in sub regulation (1)(a), (b) and (c), but each of those matters is to be the subject of a review at least once every 3 calendar years.
- (3) The CEO is to report to the audit committee the results of that review."

In addition to the requirement for the CEO to prepare a report as outlined in clause 17, the Regulation also stipulates an additional responsibility for the Audit Committee as detailed in clause 16(c) which states:

- "(c) is to review a report given to it by the CEO under regulation 17(3) (the CEO's report) and is to
  - (i) report to the council the results of that review; and
  - (ii) give a copy of the CEO's report to the council."

## Issue

To consider a request for additional funding for the Abbeville Park Sports Amenities Building Extension Project.

# **Background**

Abbeville Park (the Park) is located at 17 Abbeville Circle in Mindarie and includes a single multi-purpose active reserve suitable for rectangular and oval sports, and comprising of cricket match and practice wickets, two change rooms and toilets (no showers), floodlighting (100 lux large ball sport completion level) car park, playground, basketball hoop and passive park furniture (Attachment 1).

The Park is used by the Mindarie Football Club (soccer), the Mindarie Little Athletics Club, the Quinns Rocks Junior Cricket Club and the Department of Education (Mindarie Primary School).

The Mindarie Football Club is a key stakeholder in the project as the beneficiaries of a Local Projects, Local Jobs grant of \$400,000. A portion of the funding has been used to increase the floodlighting at the reserve to 100 lux, with the remaining grant used to part fund the Abbeville Park Sports Amenities Building Extension Project that is scheduled to be completed by 28 August 2019.

The Mindarie Football Club has a membership of 259 players, with 21 junior teams and two senior teams and uses the facilities at Abbeville Park for a total of 22.5 hours per week.

## Detail

The Abbeville Park Sports Amenities Building Extension Project will extend the existing building to include the following elements within the staging as indicated below:

Stage 1 of the project (PR-4118 Abbeville Park Mindarie – Upgrade Storage Room) is currently in progress with the construction of the additional storerooms and the shell of the kitchen and kiosk area as per the original scope of the project. The scope of works for this stage was largely influenced by the needs of the resident Clubs as known at that time, with the budget set accordingly.

As a result of further discussions held with the Mindarie Football Club, it has become apparent that there is a pressing need for the fit out of the kitchen/kiosk area and the provision for an external storage area to enable the Club to store their portable goals in a secure manner. This is primarily in response to the growth being experienced by the Club in the past few seasons, noting that the provision of the external goal storage will assist in training and game day logistics. Further the delivery of a functioning kitchen/kiosk facility will assist the Club with service delivery to its membership base and provide an important revenue stream.

Administration has undertaken costings for each of these elements to be completed as a part of the existing stage 1 works, to maximise value for money. The related works and proposed method of implementation is as per below:

- External Storage to be undertaken as additional works within the existing Builder's scope;
- Kiosk fitout preliminary works to be undertaken as additional works within the existing Builder's scope to maximise value for money and expedite the kiosk installation;
- Kiosk installation to be implemented via a separate Request for Quotation process (RFQ 19164) immediately after the completion of the building shell.

The timing of the discussions with the Club and the subsequent development of the additional design and cost estimates has meant that this process was not able to be completed prior to Council's adoption of the 2019/20 Budget.

#### Consultation

Initial consultation in relation to the Abbeville Park Sports Amenities Building Extension Project was undertaken between the dates of 11 March and 25 March 2019 and included the Community Information – Letter including Storage Building Plan and Opportunity to comment (Attachment 2).

The results of this consultation process resulted in no feedback regarding the project. Administration also consulted with the Mindarie Football Club, Mindarie Little Athletics Club, Quinns Junior Cricket Club and the Quinns Districts Junior Football Club in respect to the building design.

It should also be noted that an Inform process was undertaken prior to the commencement of the Floodlighting Upgrades at Abbeville Park.

The consultation process has been undertaken in accordance with the City's Community Engagement Policy.

## Comment

As noted within this report, the Mindarie Football Club is a key stakeholder in this project and is a Club that is experiencing continued growth in membership.

In discussion with the Club post finalisation of the project budget, it became apparent that there is a pressing need for the fit out of the kitchen/kiosk area and for the provision for an

external storage area to enable the Club to store their portable goals in a secure manner. This is primarily in response to the growth being experienced by the Club, noting that the provision of the external goal storage will assist in training and game day logistics (and the safe a secure storage of the goals) and the delivery of a functioning kitchen/kiosk facility to service the needs of the Club's members and visiting teams and spectators, providing an important revenue stream for the Club.
